- A chance to respond to the needs of a local community.



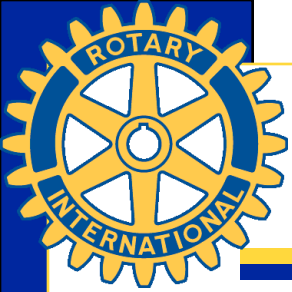


Community Service Projects

- shares information and ideas with Rotarians in the district.

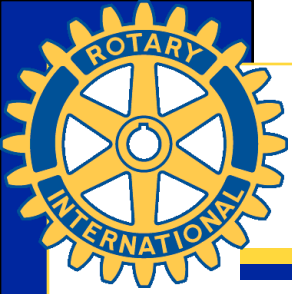

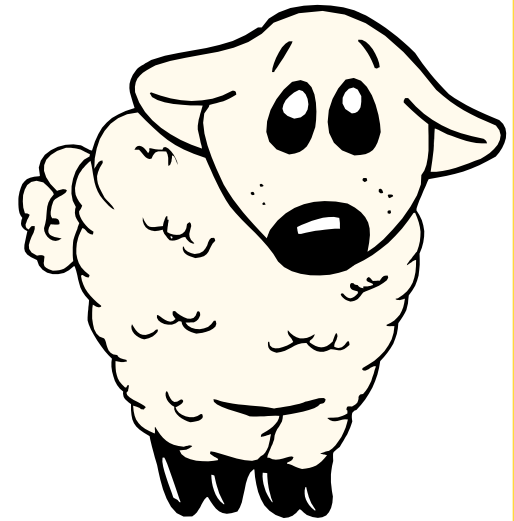
Australian Rotary Health (ARH)/BeyondBlue

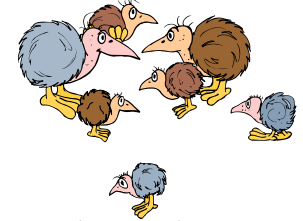

■ Project and Community Service Grants



Advisor:

- [Community Assist Program](#) Program jointly established by Forestry Tasmania and Southern Cross Television Community Assist to provide funding to organisations and individuals working to improve their communities (with links to application forms as available)
- [Community Recreation Grants Program](#) Details of Sport and Recreation Tasmania's grants program which supplies funding for projects which address barriers to participation in sport and recreation
- [Cycling for Active Transport Local Infrastructure Development Fund](#) This fund has been allocated for the next 2 financial years to support the Active Transport Strategy encouraging more people to walk or cycle. Funding is available to local government and not-for-profit community based organisations for new projects and initiatives that support this aim. Submissions for first round by 3 June
- [Fishwise Community Grants](#) Annual program providing funds for individuals and community groups to undertake small projects that contribute to improving the management of, and community education on, marine recreational fisheries

- [Gambling Support Program grants programs](#) Department of Health and Human Services information on grants available to charitable organisations through the Community Support Levy, derived from profits from gaming machines, as part of the Gambling Support Program
- [LGBTI Grants Program 2010-11](#) Tasmanian Government program to provide grants to community organisations to assist progress towards the Tasmania Together benchmarks for the lesbian, gay, bi-sexual, transgender and intersex (LGBTI) community. Includes guidelines and application form
- [Office of Children and Youth Affairs: grants](#) Details of funding available to the youth and children's sector, through the Tasmanian Office of Children and Youth Affairs
- [Positive Ageing Small Grants Program](#) The grants program supports community groups and local government in developing programs and activities that foster positive ageing
- [Tasmanian Early Years Foundation: grants](#) The Foundation's Funding Program provides annual grants to government and not-for-profit organisations for projects that support and promote the wellbeing, development and learning of Tasmanian children up to the age of six years



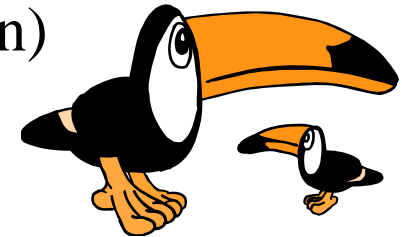

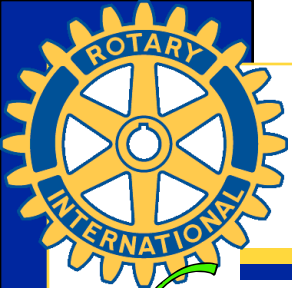

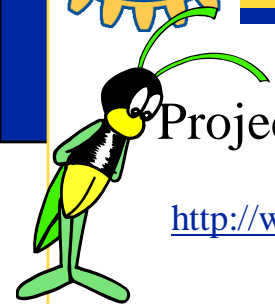
The aims of Bowelscan are to promote bowel cancer screening and to make easy to use test kits available at an affordable price.
